Simple Daily Morning Prayer: Rite II

According to the 1979 Book of Common Prayer

This liturgy is largely fixed, but has minor variations to reflect the tenor of the seasons, feasts, and fasts of the Church year as follows: **Festal Days** include the days from Christmas Day through the First Sunday after the Epiphany, the days from Easter Day through Pentecost Day, Sundays outside of Advent and Lent, and Major Feasts. All other days of the year are **Ferial Days**.
